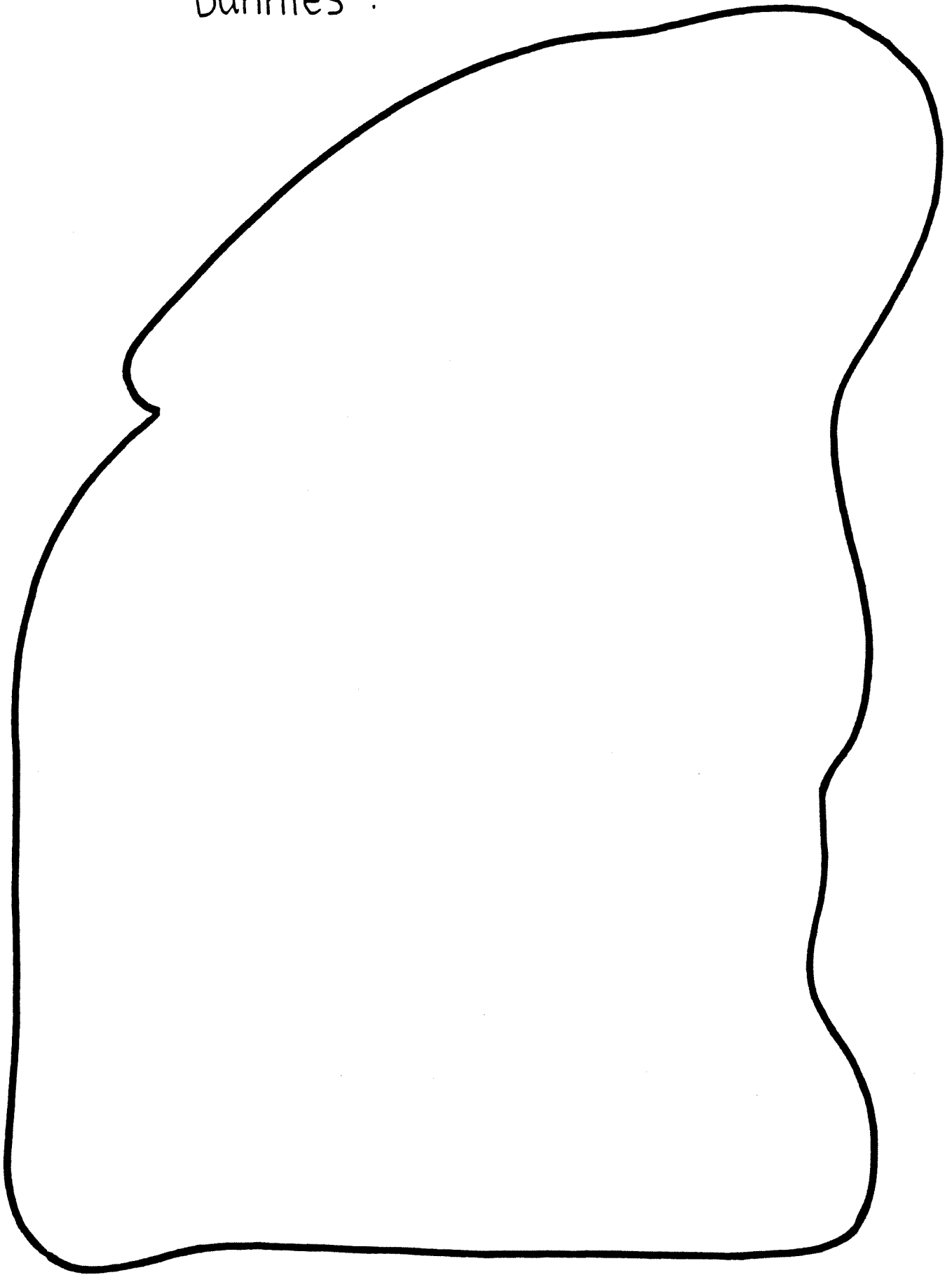

Lesson # 9 - Easter - *The Easter Eggs*

Suggested Teaching Strategies

When doing a **Staged Performance**, the teacher should have the ultimate choice as to which parts are assigned to specific students. Students, however, should be encouraged to make suggestions to the teacher, and feel free to volunteer for a favourite part. The teacher should pay close attention to shy or reluctant readers. A cast list should be announced and even posted in the classroom. Rehearsals should be scheduled and the date and time of the actual performance should also be posted so the actors will know how much time they have to prepare for their roles.

Theme: "Easter: The Easter Eggs" - *The significance of Christ's resurrection to Christianity.*

Background:

Easter is celebrated on the Sunday following the first full moon after the vernal equinox. In the Christian world, no other *Holy Day* can match the importance of Easter Sunday. It is the symbolic day in which Jesus was resurrected. Furthermore, His resurrection marked a reconciliation between God and man, thus opening the doors of resurrection for all mankind. The events of the resurrection are found throughout scripture but most prominently in the Gospels.

While the feast of Easter was first celebrated in the second century, it wasn't until Constantine called *The Council of Nicaea* in 325 A.D., that a date was officially pronounced.

The word Easter is believed to have originated either after the Anglo-Saxon Goddess of Spring, **Eostre**, or the rising of the sun in the east. Even today, many churches have early morning sunrise services on Easter. There are other peculiar traditions associated with Easter including the Easter Lily, new clothing, the Easter Rabbit, and the Easter Egg.

MRS. GILLIS: What else is Easter about then?

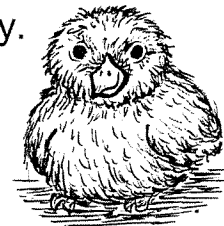
MARY: A big Easter dinner of turkey or ham with all the trimmings and pumpkin pie.

JANE: I do not. I don't even wear make-up.

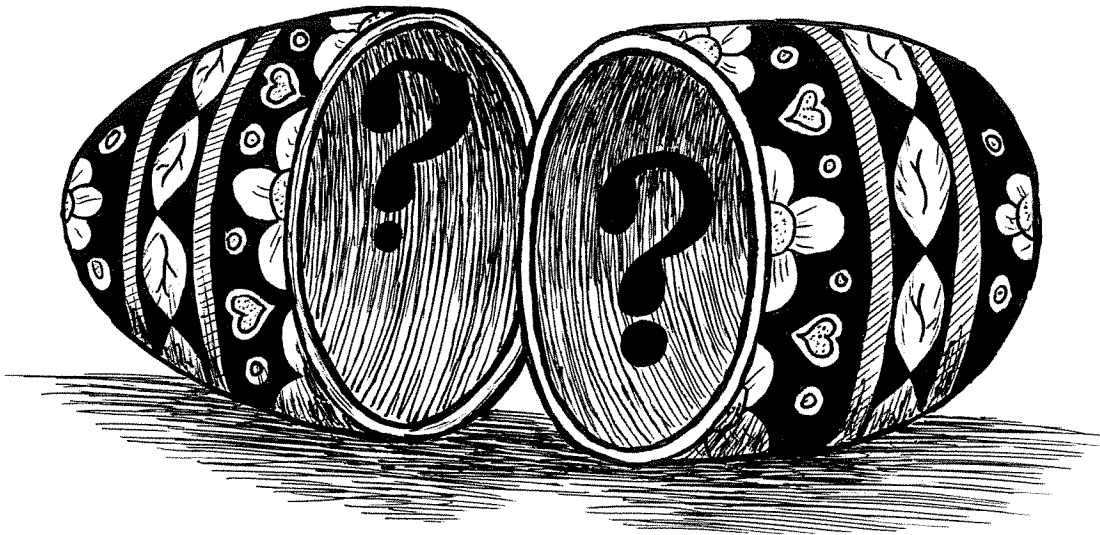
MRS. GILLIS: Let's get back to my original question. What is Easter all about?

MRS. GILLIS: You all had some very interesting ideas. I think we have seen that Easter is celebrated in different ways by Christians all over the world. What I'm going to do now is give each of you one of these plastic eggs. You'll notice you can take the egg apart in the middle and it is hollow inside. I want each of you to take your egg home this afternoon and find something that has to do with Easter to put in it - then bring it back tomorrow morning. I will expect you to share your egg and its contents with the class. Whatever you choose will have to be quite small - small enough to fit inside the egg. The student with the most interesting object will win a prize.

SEAN: It'll have to be pretty small, Mrs. G.

MRS. GILLIS: That's right, Sean. So everyone use your imagination.



NARRATOR: The next day, the students all return with their Easter eggs.

MRS. GILLIS: Alright class, one at a time, I would like you to come up to the front and show the other students what object you placed in your egg and explain why it is important in the celebration of Easter.

JANE: I put a little bonnet from one of my dolls in my egg. It's to show how, in the olden days, the ladies would buy colourful bonnets at Easter time.

SEAN: I put a chocolate egg in mine. Chocolate eggs have been a big part of Easter for many years.

RAY: I put a toy plastic turkey in mine. It reminds me that we eat turkeys at Easter.

MARY: I put a little crucifix in my egg. It reminds us that Easter is a Christian holiday.

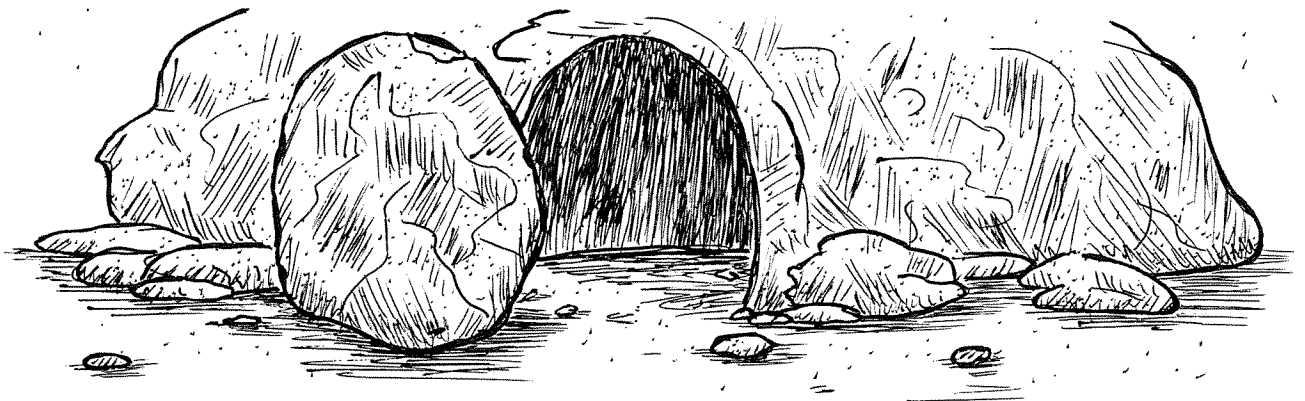

RENE: I understood the assignment, Mrs. G. I put nothing in the egg because an empty egg reminds me that when the followers of Jesus went to his tomb on Easter Sunday, they found nothing inside. It was empty because he had risen from the dead.

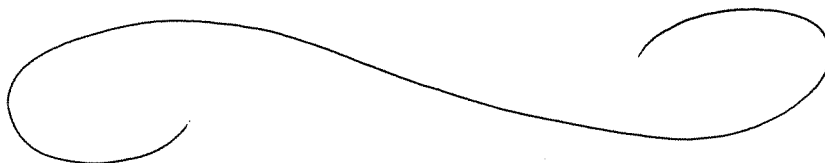

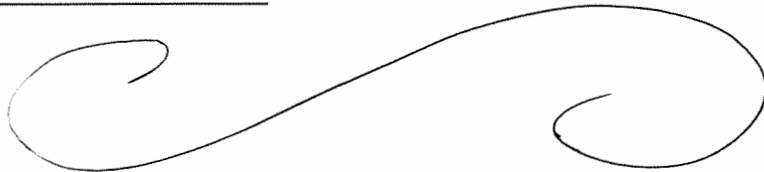

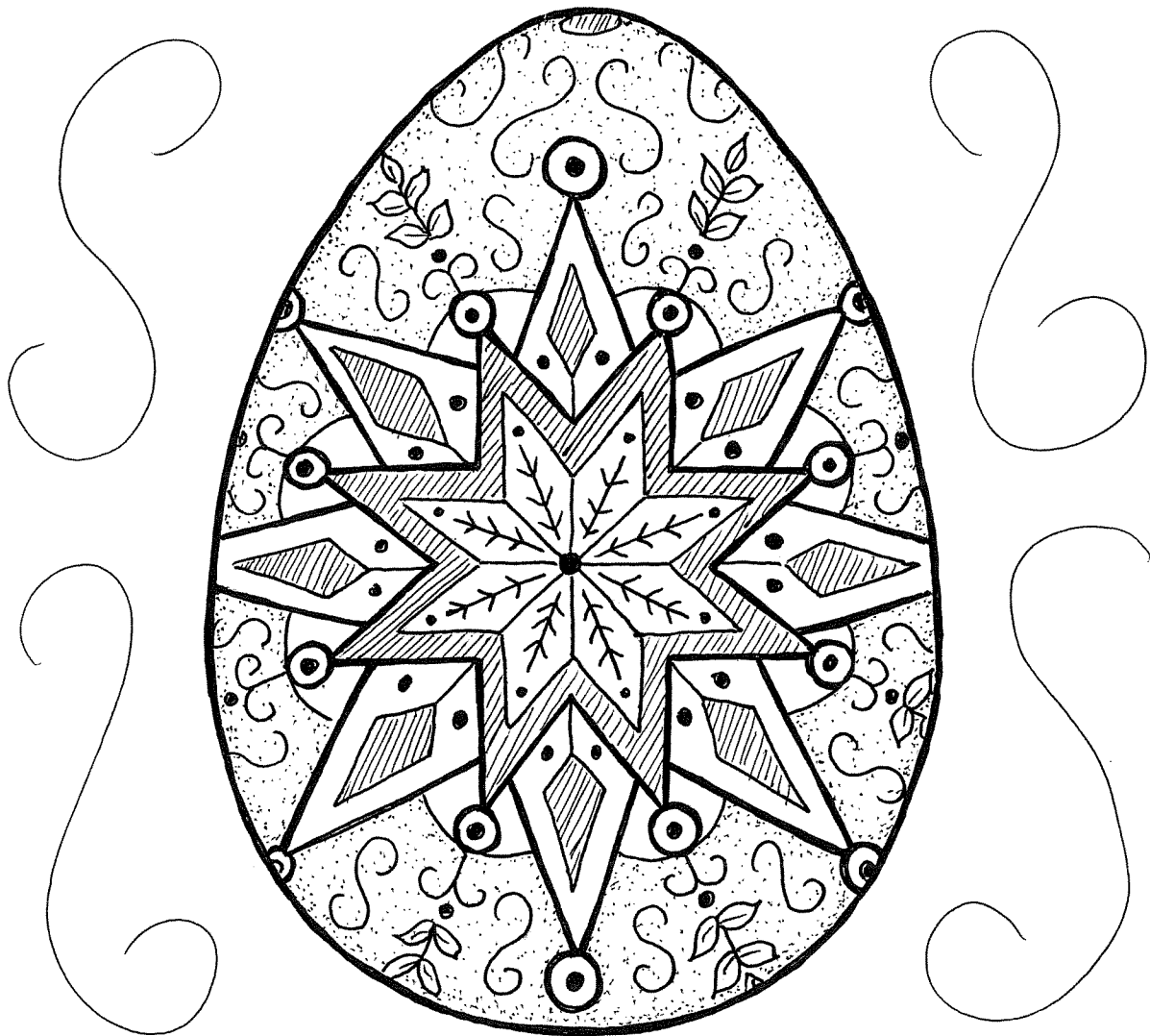
Creative Writing
